The following are explanations of the various levels of academic standing. Understanding these levels should enable you to adjust your approach to your studies to bring about greater success.

The services of the entire University community are available to you. You should take advantage of those services that can help you the most.

Requirements for Graduation

The following are the minimum requirements for graduation:

- Completion of all necessary course work
- Minimum 2.0 grade point average (some programs require higher major GPA's)
- 120 total credits

Academic Probation

First-year freshman students with lower than a 1.8 grade point average or continuing students with lower than a 2.0 grade point average will be placed on **academic probation**.

Academic probation has the following restrictions/requirements:

- Pass/fall option disallowed
- 15 credit course load maximum for Upperclassmen and 12 credit course load maximum for Freshmen
- Mandatory meeting with an appropriate dean
- Tutoring recommended
- Counseling Center visit recommended

Continuing Academic Probation

Students who continue to have a grade point average lower than 2.0 for more than one term but demonstrate improvement may be placed on **continuing academic probation**. Continuing academic probation indicates that although a student may be improving, there is still reason to be concerned. **Continuing academic probation** has the same restrictions/requirements as those listed above for academic probation.

Academic Suspension

- Students are academically suspended for:
- failure to meet the G.P.A. requirements shown below
 - dean's determination of serious academic dishonesty violation(s), such as cheating, forgery, or plagiarism

G.P.A. Requirements

Attempted Credits	24-47	48-71	72-95	96+
Minimum cumulative GPA needed	1.5	1.8	1.9	2.0

Academic Suspension has the following restriction: further registration is denied until the student meets with the appropriate dean and a formal academic evaluation is completed.

Financial Aid Suspension

- A student's financial aid will be suspended for:
- failure to meet the G.P.A. requirements shown above
 - failure to meet the minimum course completion rate shown below

Course Completion Rate Requirements

Attempted Credits	24-47	48-71	72-95	96-119	120-180
Minimum Completion Rate	50%	54%	58%	62%	67%

Academic Dismissal

- Students may be placed on **academic dismissal** for the following:
- failure to recover from academic suspension
 - dean's determination of serious academic dishonesty violation(s), such as cheating, forgery, or plagiarism
- Academic dismissal** carries the following penalties:
- cancellation of any current registration
 - inability to return to Saint Peter's University
